Modern Language Requirement.....0-8

All students completing a B.A. in Criminal Justice - Police shall complete the first two semesters of a second language. Students may alternatively fulfill the language requirement by proof of academic work in the second language (CLEP test through LANG 1224), four years of high school language courses, or transfer work from another institution. (Spanish highly recommended for Criminal Justice majors.)

Electives to bring total to..... 124

The number of credits needed to meet degree requirements under this agreement exceeds the 124 hour minimum and will vary according to course selection.

Minimum Grade Requirements

1. Average in (a) all college course work, and (b) course work at UCO.....2.50
2. Average in major courses.....2.50

Students must meet all bachelor degree requirements at UCO to include:

- 60 hours from a baccalaureate granting institution
- 40 hours of upper division coursework
- 30 hours in residence at UCO
- 15 of the last 30 hours must be taken in residence at UCO
