(May be taken at OCCC) This signifies that a UCO course requirement can be met with the equivalent OCCC course (found on the UCO website). To take these courses at OCCC, students should confirm with their advisors that the course/s will fit into the associate degree without exceeding the requirements. A minimum of 60 hours must be taken at a baccalaureate granting institution. Exceeding 64 credit hours at the community college means the student will be required to take more than the minimum of 124 credit hour total. A minimum of 40 hours of 3/4000 level courses is required for the baccalaureate. Courses from community colleges are 1/2000 level.
