To comply with this agreement, students must complete the associate’s degree with the major listed above and include the specific courses listed below.

**Courses listed here are required for the agreement. Credited courses completed as part of the A.A. or A.S. that do not apply to the general education at OSU-OKC or the UCO major transfer to UCO as electives.**

**This degree requires additional course work, including the general education, as stated in the OSU-OKC Catalog. Other OSU-OKC courses may or may not apply to the UCO major. That specific information can be found on the UCO website under the Online Transfer Guide.**

(May be taken at OSU-OKC.) This signifies that a UCO course requirement can be met with the equivalent OSU-OKC course (found on the UCO website). To take these courses at OSU-OKC, students should confirm with their advisors that the course/s will fit into the associate degree without exceeding the requirements. A minimum of 60 hours must be taken at a baccalaureate granting institution. Exceeding 64 credit hours at the community college means the student will be required to take more than the minimum of 124 credit hour total. A minimum of 40 hours of 3/4000 level courses is required for the baccalaureate. Courses from community colleges are 1/2000 level.

### Minimum Grade Requirements

1. Average in (a) all college course work, and (b) course work at UCO.....**2.50**
2. Average in major courses.....**2.50**

Students must meet all bachelor degree requirements at UCO to include minimums of:

- 40 hours of upper division coursework
- 30 hours in residence at UCO
- 15 of the last 30 hours must be taken in residence at UCO
- 60 hours from baccalaureate granting institutions
